ATTENDANCE:

Student attendance tracking will continue the same as we have done throughout the year and will be taken on the Social Emotional Learning (SEL) Days and Academic eLearning Days.

WHAT ARE SOCIAL EMOTIONAL LEARNING (SEL) DAYS?:

Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) is the process through which children and adults acquire and effectively apply the knowledge, attitudes, and skills necessary to understand and manage emotions, set and achieve positive goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain positive relationships, and make responsible decisions (<u>CASEL</u>). During these uncertain times, SEL is more important than ever. We have chosen three competencies to focus on for our SEL mini lessons: Mindset, Regulation, and Connection.

On SEL Days (Mondays), a mini lesson that should take a maximum of 30 minutes to complete will be pushed out to your children. We encourage you to take an active part in this learning as well, if you so choose. The lessons are designed for the following groups: Grades K-2, Grades 3-5, Grades 6-8, and Grades 9-12. Lessons will be pushed out by the student's classroom teacher in grades K-5 and at grades 6-12, one of the student's teachers will push out the lesson and will communicate with your student on how to access the lesson.

ACADEMIC LESSONS, ASSIGNMENTS & ACTIVITIES:

Our teachers are continuing to focus on the essential standards for their subject areas in order to maintain some continuity of learning.

Elementary students (Grades K-5) will continue to focus on literacy (40ish minutes), math (30ish minutes) and a special area (30ish minutes) for each academic learning day.

Students in grades 6-12 will continue to have assignments for each course in which they are enrolled. Total learning for each class/subject should take 30ish minutes.

MEALS FOR STUDENTS

We will continue to offer free breakfasts and lunches for children eighteen years of age or younger during spring break and after spring break. Starting Monday, April 6, we will adjust our pick up times to 10 am-1 pm on Mondays and Thursdays at our seven locations:

- Milford School main entrance
- Milford Library parking lot
- Syracuse School main entrance
- Syracuse Community Center parking lot
- Bowen Center in Enchanted Hills parking lot
- North Webster School Door 3
- North Webster Community Center parking lot

On **Mondays**, 3 breakfasts and 3 lunches can be picked up per child; and on **Thursdays**, 2 breakfasts and 2 lunches can be picked up per child along with Boomerang Backpacks for those students receiving them. Parents/Guardians are encouraged to bring a bag or box with them if they are picking up meals for more than one child.

LEARNING PACKETS FOR STUDENTS WITHOUT INTERNET/CONNECTIVITY

Students who have no Internet/connectivity who received learning packets during these past three weeks will have new learning packets delivered to their homes on Tuesday, April 14, sometime during the afternoon. If no one is at home, the learning packets will be left in the front door. If students have not been able to take pictures of completed assignments and email them to their teachers (preferred for safety reasons and can be done using wifi spots mentioned under the Technology Support and Wifi Access section) or returned the packets when picking up meals, students should leave their completed assignments in the learning packet envelope and place them in their front door to be picked up on Tuesday, April 14.

TECHNOLOGY SUPPORT AND WIFI ACCESS

Beginning March 30th, the Tech Office will be open on Tuesdays and Fridays only, for device repair, exchange, or pickup. You can contact me via email: dvanlue@wawasee.k12.in.us to let me know when you are coming. Please include your student's name, building, and grade level. I will be available on those days from 9:00 am until 3:00 pm. If your student's repaired device is returned to us, we will contact you to come and pick it up.

Since we are unable to process repairs as we normally would during this time, please make sure your students are taking extra care with their devices to keep them in good working order. Our teachers are working very hard to provide great remote learning opportunities for your students.

We now have access to outdoor wireless Internet in all of our communities. If you do not have home access, you can go to one of the 4 locations and connect to the Internet to upload or download eLearning. We also still have a limited number of T-Mobile hotspots available for those of you that do not have access at home. T-Mobile does not have the best coverage in our area, but they do work in some areas. If you would like to try one, you need to contact me via email and make arrangements to pick one up on a Tuesday or Friday.

STUDENT HEALTH

We hope that you and your students are staying healthy and active during your time at home. Try to take time each day to be active and to take care of yourselves. Spend time outside to get fresh air and exercise. The CDC and the World Health Organization have several resources to help parents care for their families during this time. Your school nurses are still available for you to contact with any questions or concerns that you might have during this time. Do not hesitate to contact them by email. If you find that you need to pick up your child's medication that was left at school, please make arrangements with your nurse for a time to pick the medication up.
