### Family/Parent Pledge

We understand that we have a high level of responsibility for our child's education. We understand that the following things are important in supporting that education:

- Attendance—attend school regularly and arrive on time.
- **Health**—get adequate sleep, proper nutrition and regular medical attention

- Study Habits—provide a quiet time and place to study, establish a location to place school papers, and monitor TV/video game viewing
- **School Involvement**—monitor student progress on a regular basis, participate in decisions about my child's education, attend parent-teacher conferences.
- Promote Reading—encourage reading every day.
- Good Modeling—discuss with and around my child the importance of education and of learning, model respect for the school, staff, students and families. If there are conflicts, model appropriate solutions to these problems.

#### School/Staff Pledge

We understand that we have a high level of responsibility for the education of the students in our care. We understand that the following things are important in supporting that education:

- Culture—provide a learning environment in which it is safe to make mistakes and students, families, and other staff members are treated with respect. Positive Behavioral Incentive System (PBIS) and Connected Learning Assures Successful Students (CLASS) initiatives are used to reinforce choices.
- **Instruction**—supply engaging activities that promote academic achievement and increase student motivation.
- Partnerships— provide opportunities for parents to be involved in their child's classroom.
- **Communication**—communicate frequently and meet annually with families about student progress and the home/school compact.
