We believe parents should know about the different forms of academic assessment used to measure students' progress.

NWEA—Grades K-5 test Fall, Winter, and Spring.

IREAD—for Grade 3

ISTEP Applied Skills and Multiple Choice for Grades 3, 4, and 5

Fountas & Pinnell Benchmark testing for Grade K, 1, and 2

STAR Early Literacy for Grade K & 1

#### Our goals:

- Each grade level in Grades 3-5 will raise its proficiency level by 3% points from Spring 2017 to Spring 2018 NWEA Language Usage RIT Scores.
- 75% of students in grades K-2 will meet an average level or above on their grade level writing prompt rubric.
- Each grade level in Grades 2-5 will raise its proficiency level by 3% points form Spring 2018 to Spring 2019 NWEA Reading RIT Scores.
- 70% of NWES students in grades K-1 will meet expected levels on the Fountas & Pinnell Benchmark Screening. (Current Rate is 67%)
- Each grade level in Grades 1-5 will raise its proficiency level by 3% points from Spring 2018 to Spring 2019 NWEA Math RIT Scores.
